Ricky Raccoon wants to run the merry-go-round - so he can sneak a ride for free. Ricky doesn't want to work. He wants to play all day.

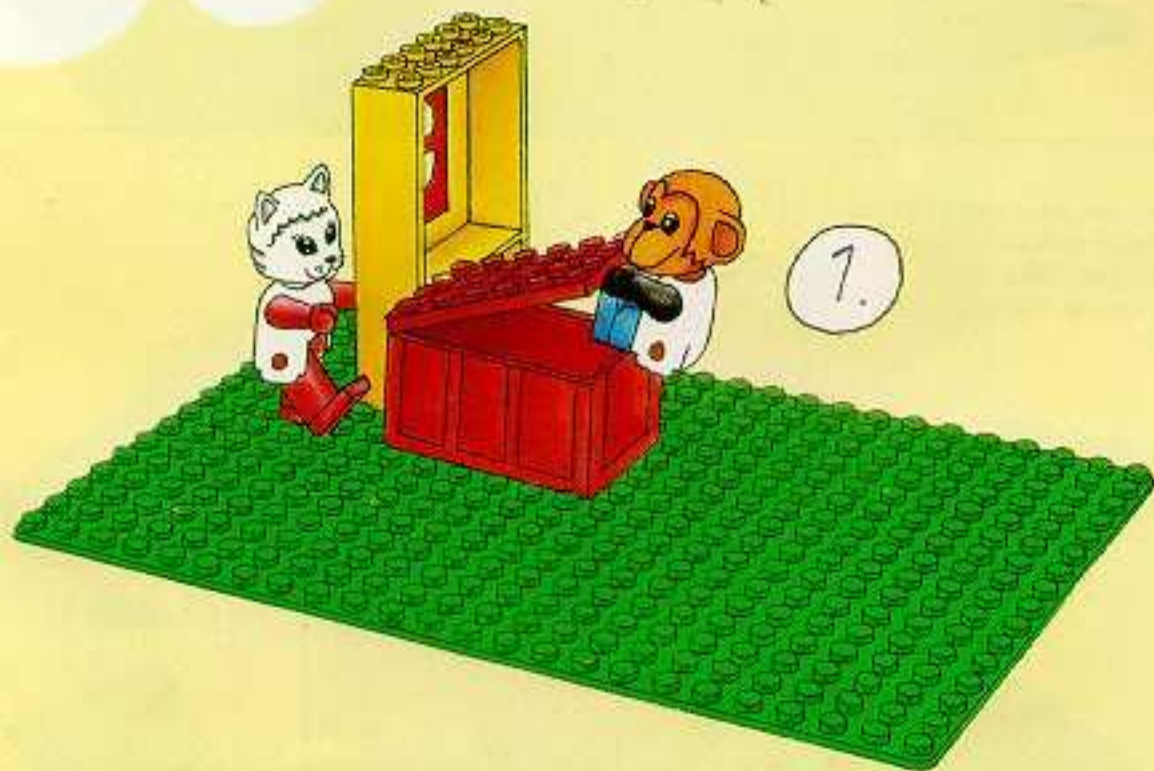


"Where do you go when the work is done?" Catherine Cat asked Mike Monkey.

"There is nowhere here to have fun."

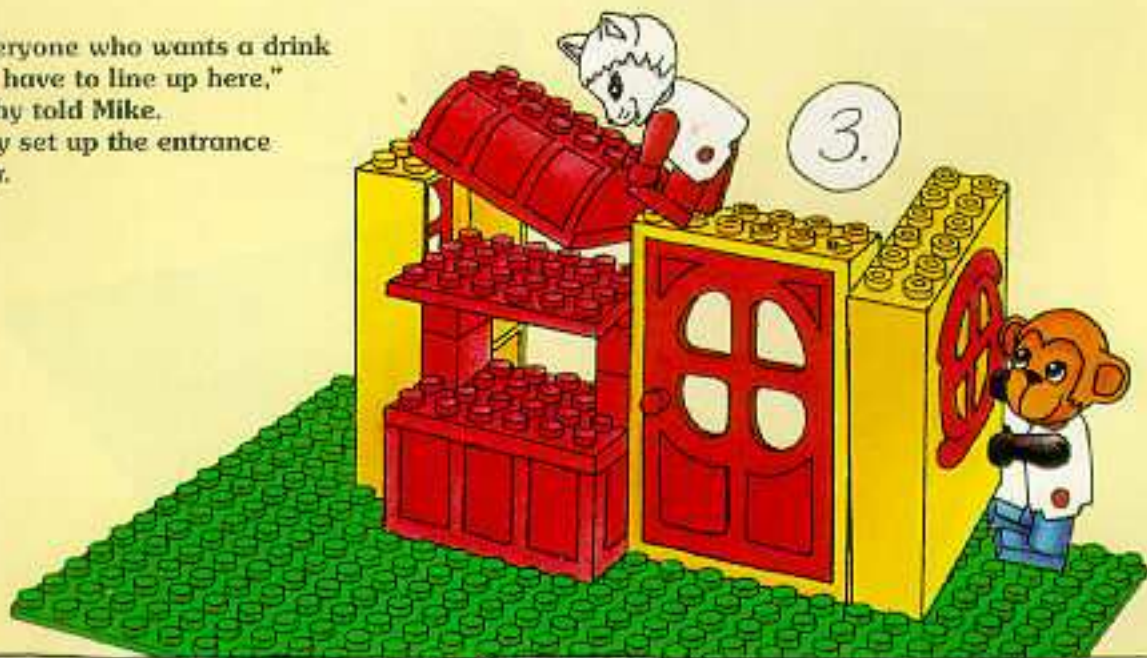
"Then let's build a FABULAND® Amusement Park!" said Cathy.

They put on the roof plate very carefully.



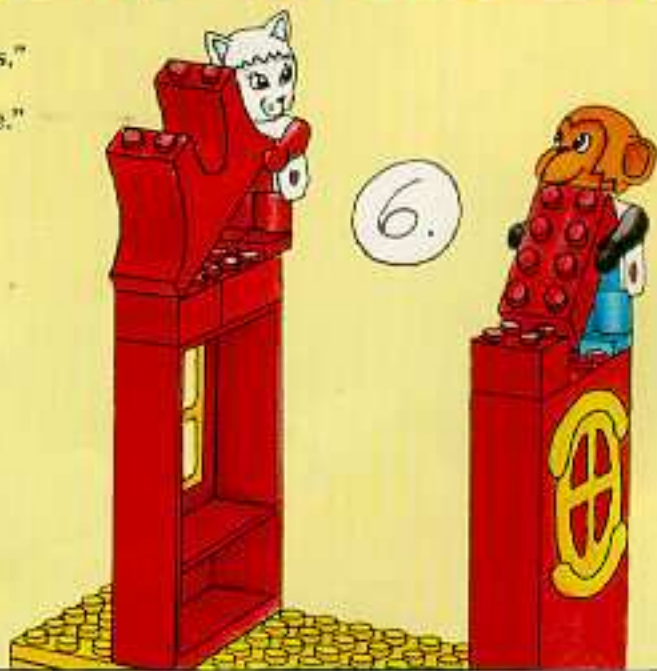
Next came the the big strong base for the ferris wheel.

"This is going to be big," said Mike.

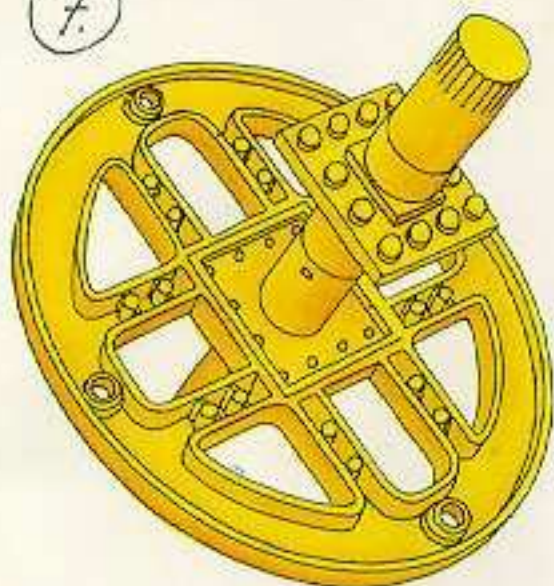


"That's why it needs these supports," explained Cathy.

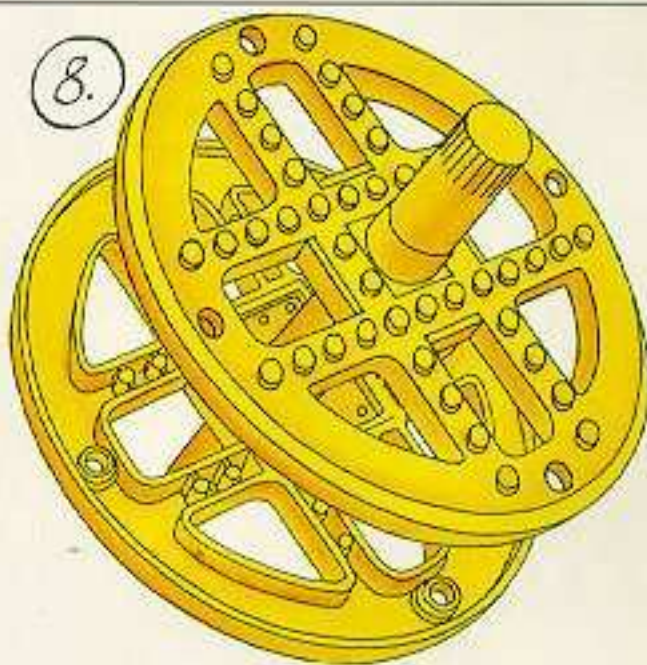
"The wheel will sit safely right here."



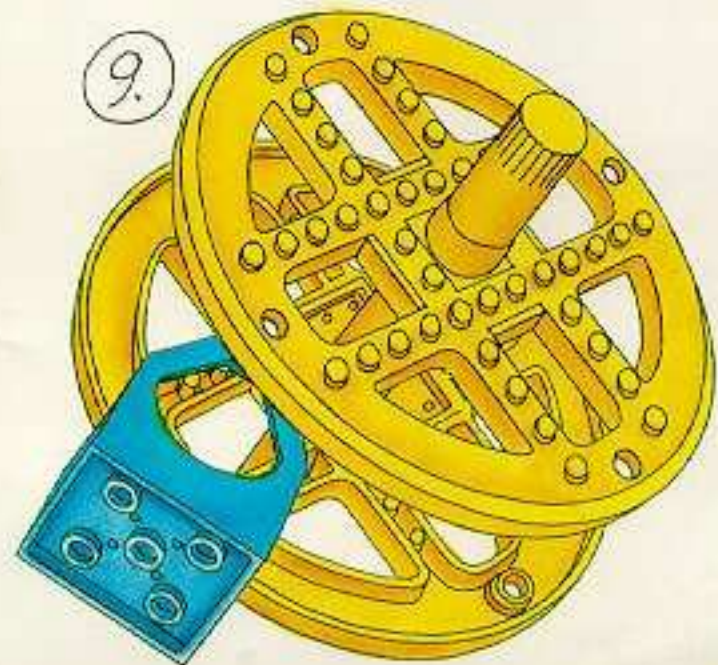

a ticket booth.



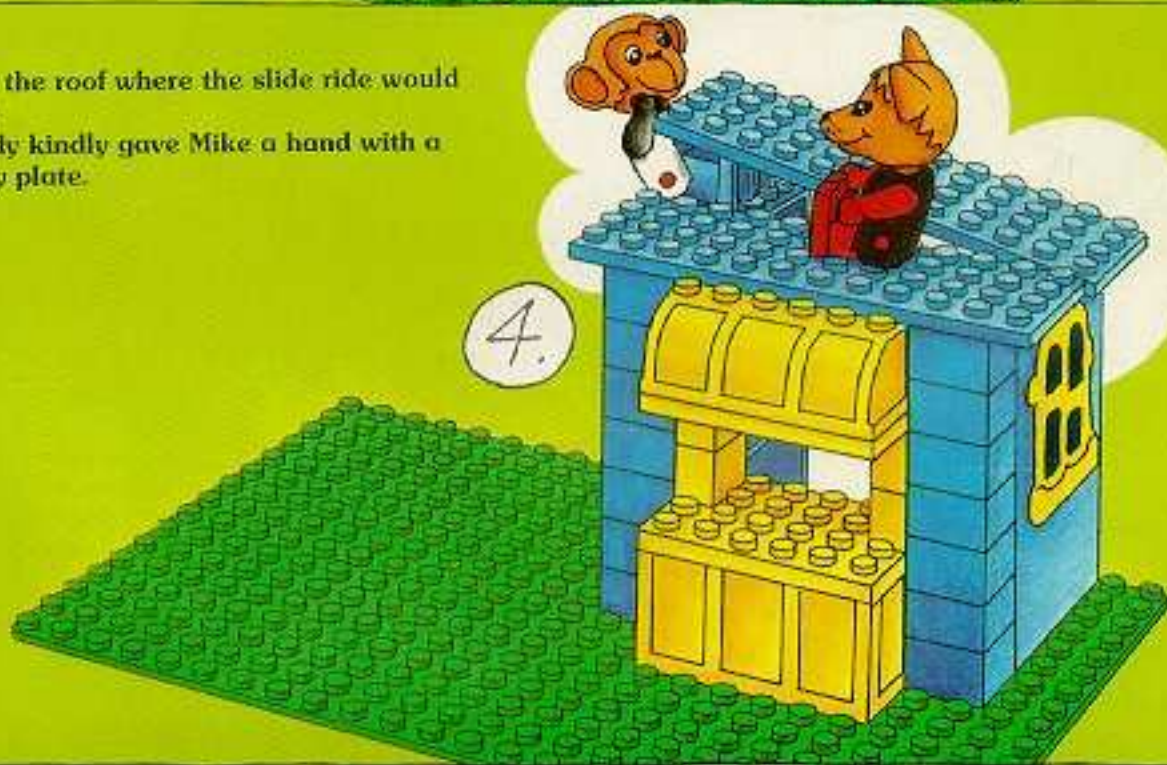
"Terrific" said Freddy happily as Mike snapped a plate into place.

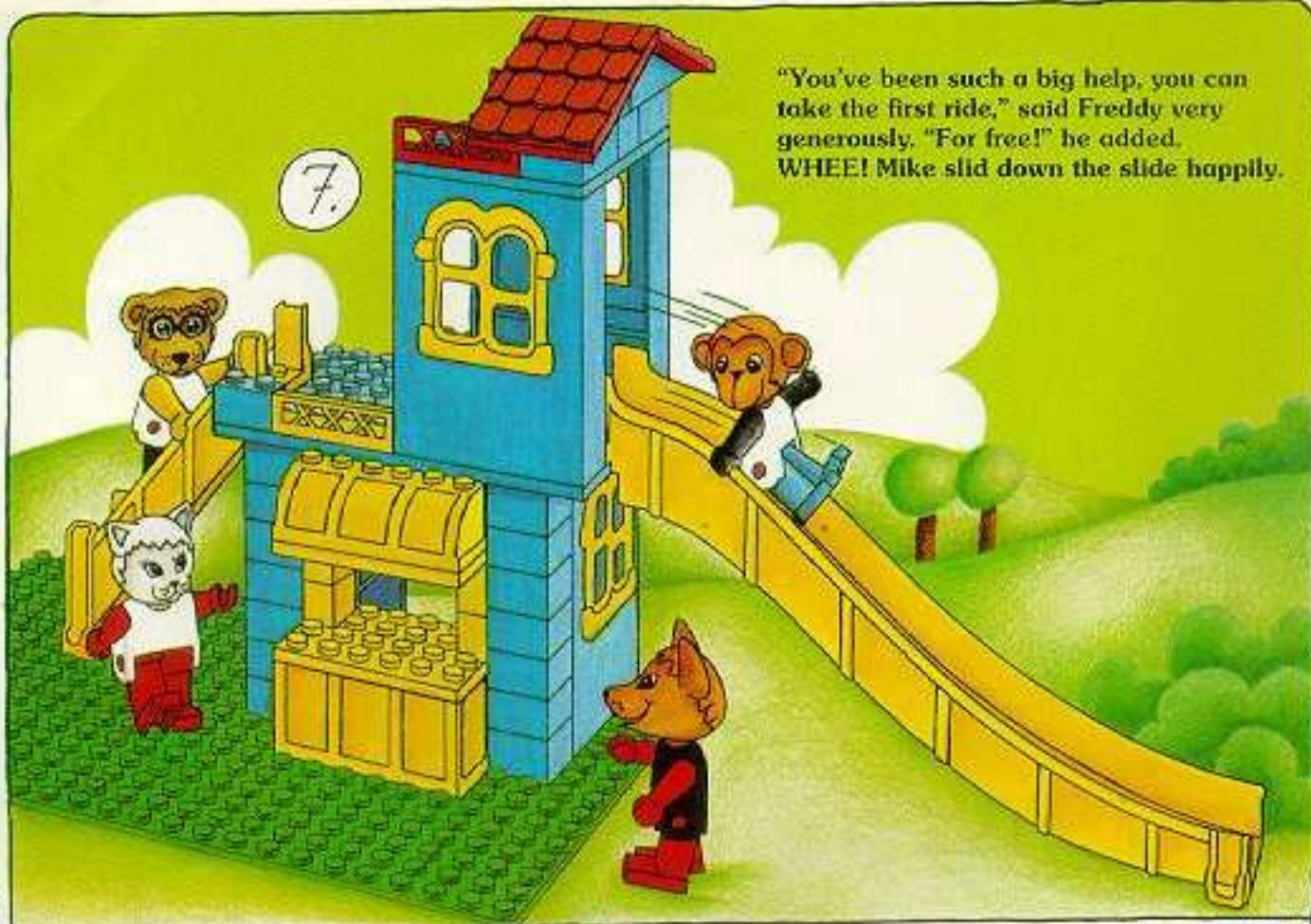


"I need a hand with the roof, Fred."

"I can't wait to ride on this," said Ricky, when the merry-go-round and picnic area were finished.



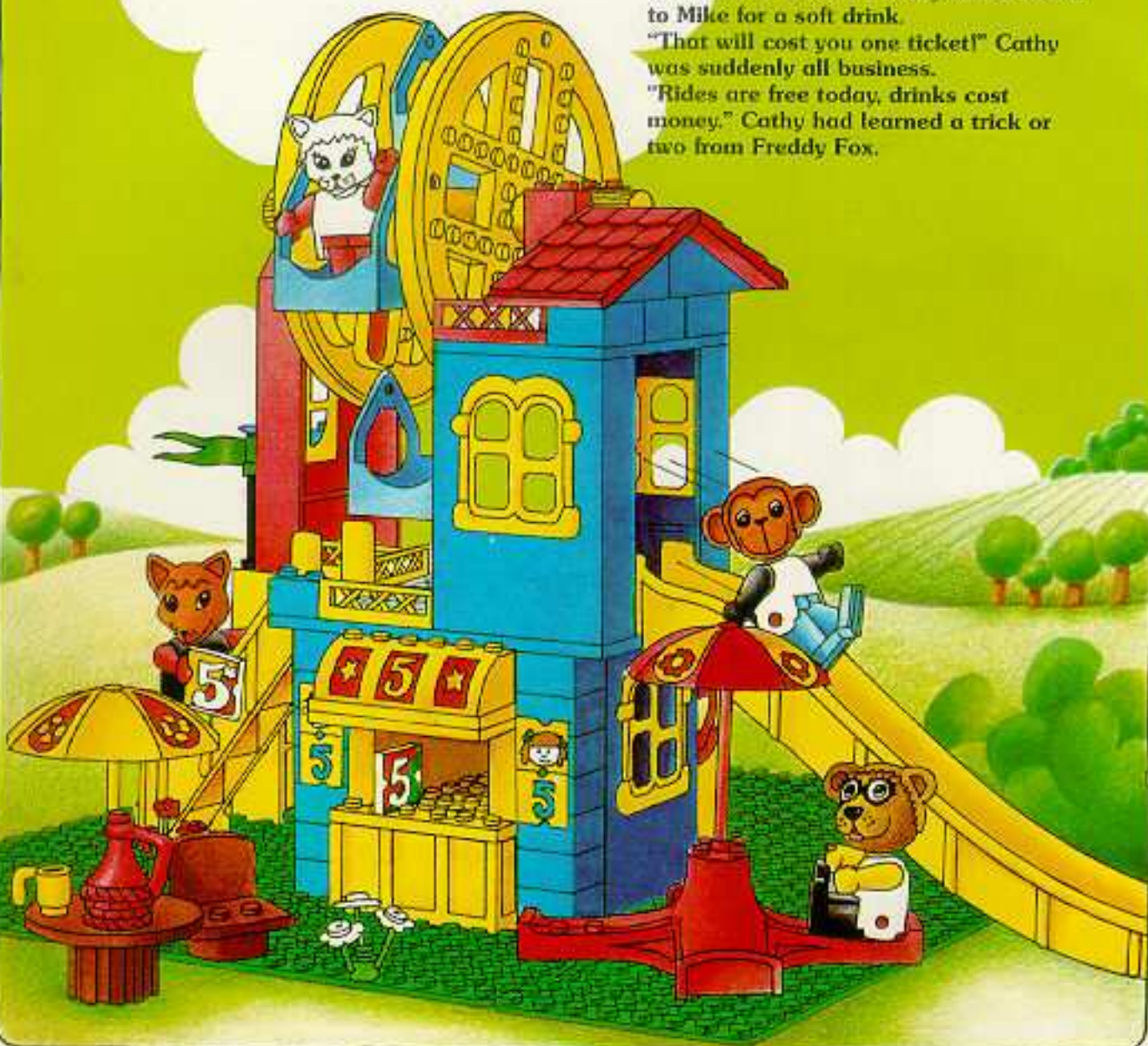


"You have to buy a ticket," said Freddy.

In the excitement of building an amusement park, they had all made one mistake. The park was too far out of town. So they built a lookout to find a new location.





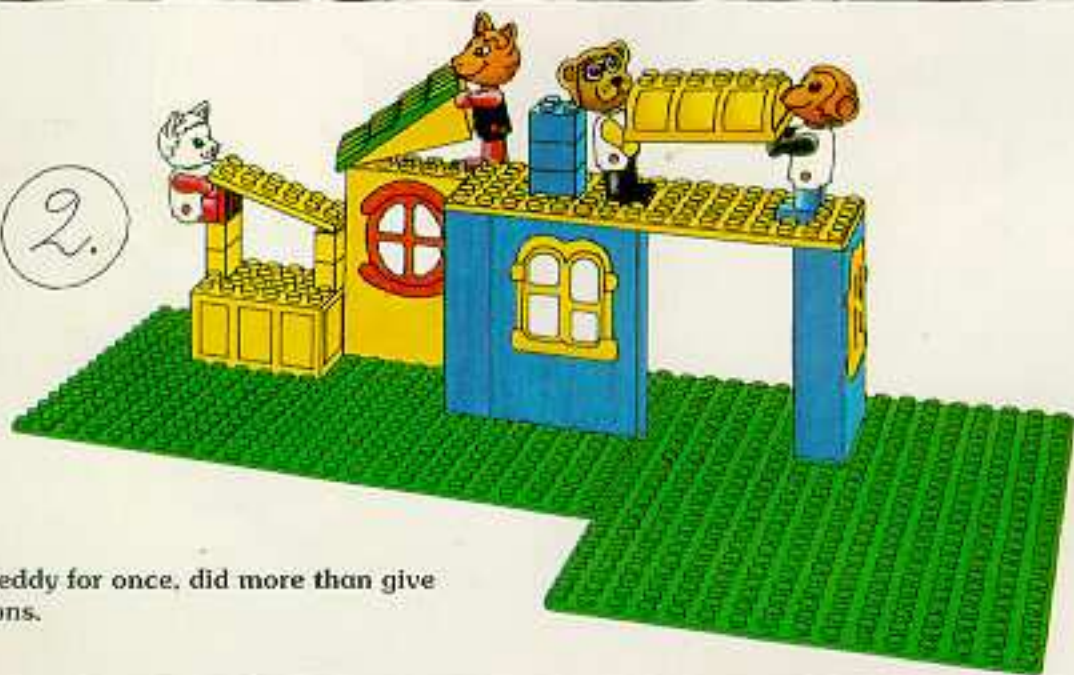

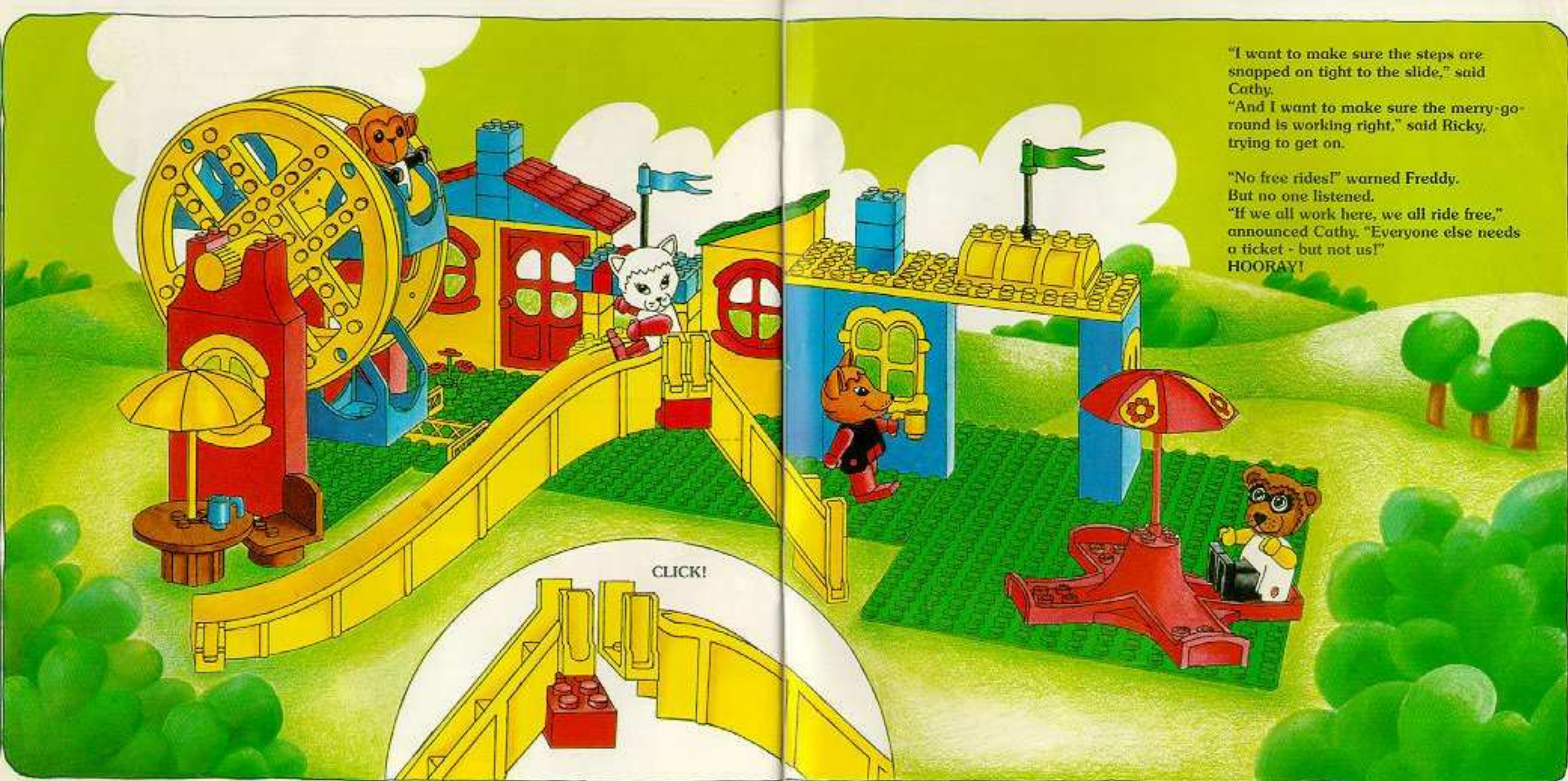
Then they started all over again, building a new amusement park. Even Ricky helped.
